Applicant has challenged the impugned order dated 13.12.2019 issued by Respondent No.2 –Superintending Engineer, PWD, Kolhapur thereby sending the Applicant on compulsory leave.</p> <p>3. Learned Counsel for the Applicant submits that impugned order is <i>ex-facie</i> illegal as there is no provision under rules to sent the Government servant on compulsory leave. He has further pointed out that the said issue has been already dealt with by this Tribunal in <i>O.A.No.197/2016 Rajaram Patil V/s Government of Maharashtra &amp; Ors</i>, wherein at the time of considering interim relief, the Tribunal has passed reasoned order staying the order of sending employee on compulsory leave.</p> <p>4. When specific quarry was made to learned P.O. as to under what rule, the Government servant can be sent on compulsory leave, she fairly concedes that there is no provision in rules. 	<p>5. Perusal of impugned order reveals that Applicant was sent on compulsory leave on allegation of negligence in discharge of duties. Even assuming for a moment that Applicant was prima-facie negligent in discharging duty, the order of sending him on compulsory leave is dehors the law and rules. Suffice to say, impugned order is <i>ex-facie</i> unsustainable in law and deserves to be stayed.</p> <p>6. For the reasons above, interim relief is granted in terms of prayer clause 15(b) of O.A..</p> <p>7. Issue notice before admission returnable on 11.02.2020.</p> <p>8. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.</p> <p>9. **ORDER**

1. Heard M/S. Talekar & Asso., learned Advocate for the Applicant, Ms. S.P. Manchekar, learned C.P.O. for the Respondents No.1 & 2, Shri M.D. Lonkar, learned Advocate for the Respondent No.4 and Ms. Sunita Vishwakarma, learned Advocate holding for Shri D.G. Mishra, learned Advocate for the Respondent No.3.

2. Applicant has approached this Tribunal against the impugned order issued on 27.09.2018, whereby the Departmental Enquiry has been initiated against him. He has been also placed under suspension.

3. The Applicant was working at Beed. His headquarters was transferred to Mumbai. Departmental Enquiry has been initiated against him for following charges :-

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4. Respondent No.3, Food Safety and Standards Authority of India has filed affidavit which reads as under :-

*"That it is respectfully submitted that all actions by the Applicant, being the Assistant Commissioner of the Food and Drug Authority (who was working as DO at that time), were done in accordance with the powers delegated to him under the FSS Act, 2006 read with the Rules and Regulations. That Applicant has not gone beyond the powers delegated under the letters issued by the Respondent No.3 as also mentioned above. The Applicant was fully authorized to act in accordance with the powers delegated under the FSS Act."*

5. Learned Advocate for the Applicant also referred to his pleadings particularly, in paragraphs 12, 13 and 15, which reads as under :-

*"12. The applicant submits that "Designated Officer" is defined under Section 3(h) whereas Food Safety Officer is defined under Section 3(t) and the term license is defined under Section 3(za) of the Act of 2006. Similarly, the expression "State Government" is defined under Section 3(zv). The Designated Officer means the Officer appointed under Section 36 whereas the Food Safety Officer means an officer appointed under Section 37. The license means "license granted under Section 31. The Designated Officer appointed under Section 36 is for the purpose of issuing licence and also for the purpose of taking actions such as suspension of licence or cancellation of licence for violation of the provisions of the Act, Rules and Regulations. The Central Government appoints Designated Officer for the purpose of issuing license whereas the State Government appoints designated officer for all purpose including issuance of license, suspension and cancellation of license.*

*13. The Designated Officer appointed by the Commissioner of Food Safety along has the power to either suspend or cancel the license. The power to implement or enforce the provisions of the Act vests in the Designated Officer appointed by the Commissioner of Food Safety under Section 36 of the Act.*

*15. The Designated Officer appointed by the Food Safety and Standards of India has a limited role i.e. to issue license. However, the Designated Authority appointed by the State Government has much wider powers i.e. to issue license to other food related businesses as well as to take action against such food related businesses for violation of rules and regulations. Section 36 of the Act of 2006 confers several powers on the Commissioner of Food Safety including the power to appoint the designated officer. The Commissioner of Food Safety is always on the establishment of the State and has to work under the control of the State Government. The Commissioner of Food Safety appoints the Designated Officer to be in-charge of Food Safety administration in such areas as may be specified by the Regulations and declares the local areas of a district under the jurisdiction of the Designated Officer. Thus, there is an independent Designated Officer for every district appointed by the Commissioner of Food Safety under Section 36(1) of the Act, 2006 which is evident from the Notification dated 09.01.2012, copy of which is annexed herewith and marked as Exhibit "L".*

6. Learned Advocate for the Applicant has referred to the provisions in the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, Section 36 of which reads as under :-

**"36. Designated Officer.** – *The Commissioner of Food Safety shall, by order, appoint the Designated Officer, who shall not be below the rank of the Sub Divisional Officer, to be in-charge of food safety administration in such area as may be specified by regulations.*

(2) *There shall be a Designated Officer for each District.*

(3) *The functions to be performed by the Designated Office shall be as follows, namely :-*

(a) *to issue or cancel license of food business operators ;*

7. Learned Advocate for the Applicant has therefore prayed suspension should be revoked and Departmental enquiry against him should be quashed.

8. Learned C.P.O. for the Respondents mentions that necessary Departmental Enquiry is in progress and Applicant is free to make these submissions before Enquiry Officer.

9. In light of submissions referred above, provisions under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 and the affidavit filed by Respondent No.3, Respondents are directed to review and inform this Tribunal what remains in the charges against the Applicant and what is the legal impediment in conceding the prayer by the Applicant ? Respondents are directed to file affidavit accordingly within three weeks. The matter is adjourned to 04.02.2019.

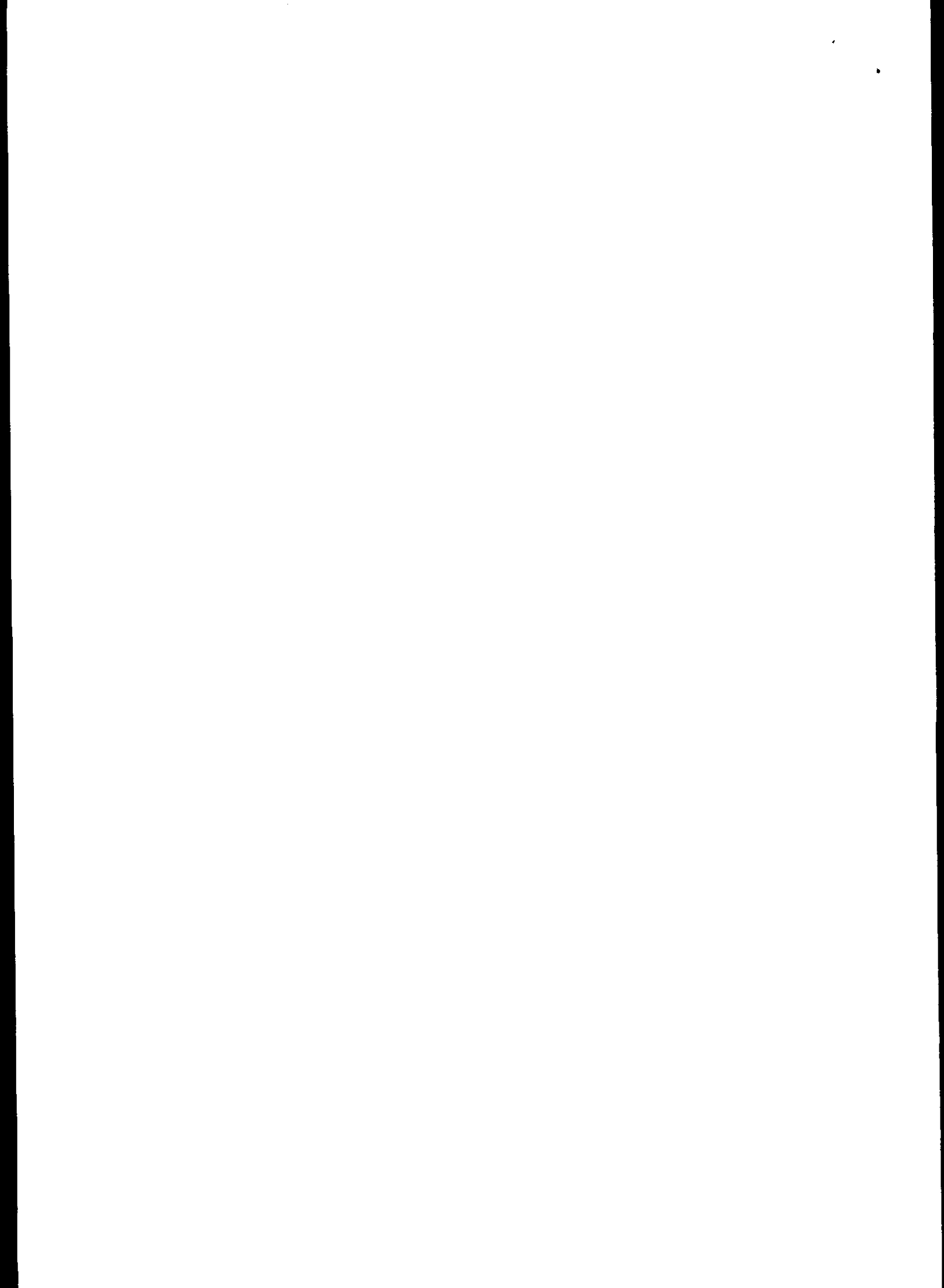
